Dear Parishioners

We are opening our church

As you are aware of the Premier's Statement on 17th October and the updated Victorian Roadmap released 19th October states that we can now open places of worship for 20 fully vaccinated people from 22nd October onwards. We are thankful to the government for allowing this.

The current restriction for places of worship is below:

Fully Vaccinated: Indoor cap of 20 with DQ4. Outdoor cap of 50 with DQ4.

Unknown Vaccination Status: Indoor cap of 10 with DQ4. Outdoor cap of 20 DQ4.

Children under 12 months old are not counted towards caps.

Archbishop's letter to Clergy on 18th Oct. 21, indicates at least one (if not more) 'Unknown Vaccination Status' Masses should be offered in each Parish per week to enable the faithful to attend.

So, we are making the following temporary arrangements after discussing with key parishioners.

St. Anne's church will open from Tuesday 26th October for public Mass. Tuesday 26th Oct. 6 pm for 20 fully vaccinated at St. Anne's church

Wednesday 27th Oct. 9:30 am for 20 fully vaccinated at Holy Family Hall

Wednesday 27th Oct. 6 pm for 10 unvaccinated St. Anne's church Thursday 28th Oct. 9:30 am for 10 unvaccinated at St. Anne's church 28th Oct. 6 pm for 20 fully vaccinated St. Anne's church Friday 29th Oct. 9:30 am for 10 unvaccinated St. Anne's church Friday 29th Oct. 6 pm for 20 fully vaccinated St. Anne's church Saturday 30th Oct. 9.30 am for 10 unvaccinated St. Anne's church

*Please join only to the allocated Mass. Apparently **NO MIXING ALLOWED**.

*The maximum numbers allowed is including the celebrant and COVID marshal.

*First come first serve, system is applicable for weekday Masses, as we have only seen less than 20 people. Use Eventbrite system to book in for Saturday and Sunday Masses. If you have been to any weekday Masses, please give chance to other parishioners.

*All Masses regardless of weekday or weekend is relevant and it's important to remember the dispensation toward the Sunday Obligation remains in place whilst we cannot offer the ample opportunity for people to attend in person.

*We will have a picture of the way forward at the end of the week. Then we will plan for the following week.

*Have patience as we work through this difficult time. We have tried our best to accommodate everyone as possible.

*Follow the directions of COVID Marshals.

*If you are vaccinated, have the vaccination certificate or proof of medical exemption linked to Service QR Victoria app and check in OR if you don't have a smart phone, bring printed copy of your vaccination certificate.

*If vaccination status is unknown, you still need to use QR code check in.

* For those with hard copy certificates, we require your Name, Contact and Acknowledgement of vaccination proof or vaccination exemption. This record will be kept securely for 28 days.

*Face mask must be used at all times unless medically exempt and sanitize your hands as you enter in the church and before receiving communion.

*Please stay back after Mass to sanitise seats

*Our worship is designed to keep all of us safe in COVID safe manner.

*Write or call us if you have any concerns.


An Act of Spiritual Communion





REFLECTIONS FOR THIS WEEK

Today we continue to read from Mark's Gospel. In this Gospel, we find evidence of Jesus' fame in the sizable crowd that accompanies him as he journeys to Jerusalem. Jesus' reputation as a healer has preceded him. When the blind man, Bartimaeus, hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, he calls out to him, asking for his pity.

When Bartimaeus calls out to Jesus, the crowd around him tries to silence him. Yet Bartimaeus persists, calling out more loudly and with greater urgency. He will not be silenced or deterred from getting Jesus' attention. We notice how quickly the crowd's reaction changes when Jesus calls for Bartimaeus. Those who sought to quiet him now encourage him.

When Jesus restores Bartimaeus's sight, no elaborate action is required. (In other healing stories in Mark's Gospel, actions accompany Jesus' words). In this instance, Jesus simply says that Bartimaeus's faith has saved him. Throughout Mark's Gospel, the success of Jesus' healing power has often been correlated with the faith of the person requesting Jesus' help. For example, it is because of her faith that the woman with the hemorrhage is healed. When faith is absent, Jesus is unable to heal; we see this after his rejection in Nazareth.

Once his sight has been restored, Bartimaeus follows Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. In Mark's Gospel, Bartimaeus is the last disciple called by Jesus before he enters Jerusalem. Bartimaeus hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, but he calls out to Jesus using words of faith—"Son of David." Many in Jesus' time believed that the anticipated Jewish Messiah would be a descendent of King David. Bartimaeus's words prepare us for the final episodes of Mark's Gospel, which begin with Jesus' preparation for the Passover and his triumphant entry into Jerusalem. As Mark has shown us in our readings over the past few Sundays, however, Jesus will be the Messiah in a way that will be difficult for many to accept. Jesus will show himself to be the Messiah through his suffering and death.
