Dear Parishioners

Latest restrictions

As of 6:00pm Friday 29 October 2021, the following measures will be applied across Victoria. Regional Victoria and Metropolitan Melbourne will unite in the roadmap and share the same restrictions.

A person is considered fully vaccinated against COVID-19 for the purposes of attending a Place of Worship if they:

- have received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine, or
- have a valid medical exemption to COVID-19 vaccination issued by an authorised medical practitioner, or
- are aged under 16.

If a person can show evidence of any of the above, they can enter as fully vaccinated. If they can't show evidence of any of the above, they are not considered as fully vaccinated and may only participate in groups allowing for 'unknown vaccination status.'

[At this stage of the roadmap, children under 16 years of age are permitted to be included in the fully vaccinated group, accompanied by their parents also fully vaccinated. It should be noted that Victoria's vaccination requirements are flagged to expand to include children aged 12 and over once the 90 per cent milestone is reached around November 24.]

Religious Gatherings and Ceremonies: Fully Vaccinated: Indoors DQ4. Outdoors DQ2. Cap of 500. So, with the latest regulation St. Anne's church can accommodate 135 fully vaccinated people at Mass.

Unknown Vaccination Status: Indoors & Outdoors cap of 30.

Children under 12 months old are not counted towards caps. Below is our Mass schedule from Friday 29 October 2021.

Important things to remember

- *Please join only to the allocated Mass. Apparently NO MIXING recommended.
- *The maximum numbers allowed is including the celebrant and Covid marshal.
- *Booking is essential for weekend Masses. Use Eventbrite system to book in. See our website for the link.
- *I am fully vaccinated.
- *All Masses regardless of weekday or weekend is relevant and it's important to remember the Dispensation toward the Sunday Obligation remains in place.
- *Have patience as we work through this difficult time. We have tried our best to accommodate everyone as possible.
- *Follow the directions of COVID Marshals.
- *We urgently need Covid marshals/greeters in order to fully comply with the requirements. Please let us know if you can help.
- *If you are vaccinated, have the vaccination certificate or proof of medical exemption linked to Service QR Victoria app and check in OR if you don't have a smart phone, bring printed copy of your vaccination certificate.
- *If vaccination status is unknown, you still need to use QR code check in.
- *For those with hard copy certificates, we require your Name, Contact and Acknowledgement of vaccination proof or vaccination exemption. This record will be kept securely for 28 days.
- *Face mask must be used at all times unless medically exempt and sanitize your hands as you enter in the church and before receiving communion.
- *Please stay back after Mass to sanitise seats.
- *Our worship is designed to keep all of us safe in covid safe manner.
- *Write or call us (during business hours) if you have any concerns.



REFLECTIONS FOR THIS WEEK

As we continue to read from Mark's Gospel, our Lectionary skips a chapter that helps set the context for today's reading. If we were to read the sections skipped (chapter 11 and part of chapter 12), we would hear about Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, his cleansing of the Temple, and the questioning of Jesus' authority by the chief priests, scribes, and elders. The context, therefore, for this Gospel is Jesus' growing exposure before the Jewish authorities. Jesus is being questioned and tested by the Jewish authorities, yet the scribe who addresses Jesus in today's Gospel seems to be an admirer; he is not testing Jesus.

The question posed in today's Gospel requires Jesus to interpret the Law of Moses. The Mosaic Law consists of the Ten Commandments and many additional commandments, numbering into the hundreds. For a devout Jew, adherence to the Mosaic Law is an expression of faithfulness to God's covenant with Israel. The ranking of these commandments was regularly debated among the teachers of the Law.

Jesus was not the only Jewish religious teacher to connect these two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor. Both of these commandments were central elements of the religious tradition that Jesus learned from his Jewish community. Indeed, these commandments continue to be central aspects of contemporary Jewish religious understanding. Jesus' response to his questioners proposed an integral connection between these two aspects of the Jewish Law. Love of God finds its expression in our love for our neighbor. Many believe, however, that this connection was heard in a new and fresh way when spoken by Jesus.

The scribe who questions Jesus in today's Gospel engages in a positive dialogue with Jesus. He agrees with Jesus' teaching that the commandments to love God and love neighbor stand above the commandment to offer worship and sacrifice in the Temple. With this dialogue, Jesus appears to close the debate with the Jewish authorities. Mark reports that no one dared to question Jesus further.

Visiting the sick

Now that we are able to visit homes (10 people per day), and care facilities for up to 5 visitors per resident per day (dependants included). Strongly recommend that all residents and visitors are fully vaccinated (subject to facility Guidelines), please let the office know if any sick parishioners need communion or anointing. Caring for the sick and the elderly is one of my utmost priority. Unless you let us know, we won't know. If sick parishioners need regular communion, please indicate.
