## 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time —Year B

## **REFLECTIONS FOR THIS WEEK**

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. In the context of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death.

Before we consider Jesus' words, it is important to note the political backdrop against which many think Mark's Gospel was written. Most scholars concur that Mark wrote his Gospel for Christians living in or near Rome about 30 to 40 years after the death of Jesus. This was a time of political turmoil in Rome. Some Christians experienced persecution by the Romans during the reign of the emperor Nero (about 64 A.D.). Jewish revolutionaries rebelled against the Romans, which led the Romans to destroy the Temple in Jerusalem in 70 A.D. In this time of political turmoil and persecution, many in Mark's community might have wondered if the end times predicted by Jesus were in fact quite near.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come, except the Father. In the verses that follow this reading in Mark's Gospel, Jesus continues to warn his disciples to be on watch for this end time.

Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we will experience during our lifetimes and at the end times. Our consolation and hope is found in the lasting nature of Jesus' words and God's never-ending love for us.

### Dear Parishioners,

Our parish has been open for worship over the last two weeks. It is exciting to welcome everyone to join for Mass. It is slow and steady gathering of parishioners. We welcome every one (fully vaccinated for weekend) to join our community celebration of Mass. We wish to remind you that the Dispensation toward the Sunday Obligation remains in place whilst we cannot offer the ample opportunity for people to attend in person. So, all Masses regardless of weekday or weekend is relevant. We still have unknown vaccination status Mass on Fridays at 9:15 am.

#### **Sacraments**

The pandemic lockdown situation had a massive impact on the sacraments of school children. As a result we are forced to celebrate the remaining sacraments immediately. The celebration of Confirmation is on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 16th of November. As with the restriction we will only have limited seats.

First Holy Communion will be on 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of November. We have a large group of children this year. So there will be two session each Sundays. Please pray for those receiving these sacraments.







Welcome to Auxiliary Bishop Tony Ireland of the Southern Region who celebrates our Confirmation Masses this week. Bishop Anthony (Tony) Ireland was born in Melbourne. In his 34 years as a priest for the Catholic Archdiocese of Melbourne, Bishop Tony has served in various academic and leadership roles, but at the heart of his ministry lies his desire to invite people to know and love the person of Jesus Christ. He served in the parishes of Grovedale and Torquay, Mentone, Sandringham, Langwarrin and Frankston. For the last 12 years he has been parish priest of St Gregory the Great in Doncaster.

During his priesthood, he undertook academic studies in Italy, receiving higher degrees in Moral and Spiritual Theology, as well as a doctorate. He has lectured in Moral Theology at Catholic Theological College in East Melbourne and was Head of the Department of Moral and Practical Theology for eight years. He has been a tutor at Corpus Christi Seminary College in Carlton, was appointed its Dean of Studies and was also Rector for a number of years. The academic [part] has been a large part of my life as a priest—the academic formation of future priests, religious, and lay people for leadership within the church,' he reflected. Through it all, it's also been about prayer and life with the people. Most of my ministry has been spent living in parishes, being with people and at the pastoral service of the people. Prayer and life with the people have always been an emphasis of my ministry. 'And for me, the thing that is really important is being with people at the right moment, for the right moment, in the right moment. It could be with someone who is vulnerable on their deathbed, or someone who is joyful about the announcement of an engagement, or the celebration of their marriage. It's about being with the people in those moments.'

Recognising that the Church faces many challenges, and inspired by his own personal relationship with Jesus Christ, Bishop Tony said he intends to be a bearer of hope 'in this moment'. 'We're in the wilderness and we're not alone. God meets us in the wilderness. The wilderness is a place of promise and that gives us hope.'

He hopes to help the Church be a 'vehicle' for introducing and reintroducing the person of Jesus Christ to others. 'The Church is the vehicle for the proclamation of the kingdom of God and the person of Jesus Christ, and for introducing people to the love, mercy and healing of Jesus Christ. Bishop Tony hopes to be a living witness to the words he has chosen for his episcopal motto "Confirm, Strengthen, Support" (1 Peter 5:10)

Though most of the parishioners may not see him for these Masses, we hope to welcome him to celebrate a weekend Mass soon. Please welcome Bishop Tony in our midst.
