TWENTY SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

REFLECTIONS OF THIS WEEK

In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us—nothing more, nothing less. When we are graced enough to cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as faithful stewards. And yet, our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold.

RENOVATION UPDATE

Dear parishioners,

Thank you for your feedback on the painting of the inner liner. Below are some of the questions the committee received and we have the answer from the painting company.

Why is the sample patch so grey?

The sample patch is actually white but appears grey as the protruding light makes it appear grey. Rest assured the final product will be pure white for optimum light reflection.

· In time is the current colour likely to change?.

No, the colour of the white will be white for as long as the paint is there.

Is there a guarantee of the paint?

· The paint will be guaranteed for 10 years as long as coating specification has been signed off (manufacturer and approved applicator to arrange)

If we have the colour different within the rounder part of the sanctuary wall, behind the cross, will it cost any more?.

- · No, the quotation includes preparation and 2 coats of paint which will be sufficient for any minor colour change (any additional costs will only incur a fee if there is a strong colour selected eg. Red/yellow) Have you a special treatment to nullify the black staining on the 2 side walls.
- · Application of a mould barrier to the affected areas upon the pretreatment and removal/neutralisation to substrates included in quotation.

The next process is informing the diocese of the renovation plan.


