THE CANDLES AND THE WREATH

FOURTH WEEK OF ADVENT

The theme of Advent's fourth Sunday is the **love** that God has for mankind to become man and save us from death and sin.

The Advent wreath has four candles - one is lit each Sunday of the four weeks of Advent. Each candle represents a new focus and time of reflection. The fourth week of Advent is the candle of love. Also known as the "angel candle," it is in this fourth week of Advent that we reflect on the ultimate gift of love -Jesus Christ. Jesus is our true example of love, and He came to teach us to love God and others.

ADVENT WREATH BLESSING

Celebrant: As we begin our celebration of the Fourth Sunday of Advent, let us prepare to light the fourth and last candle on our Advent wreath. As advent draws to a close, we pause to pray for faith that opens our lives to the Spirit of God... Let us pray

Celebrant: Come Lord Jesus, hope of the prophets Saviour was among us, although not yet and desired of all nations.

All: Come! Lead us back to you.

Celebrant: Come Lord Jesus, Son of God, born of Mary.

All: Come! Take flesh in us.

Celebrant: Come Lord Jesus, source of grace and hope for peace.

All: Come and save us, delay no longer.

Celebrant: Let us pray...

God, our Emmanuel, your eternal Word took flesh on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces his glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for his Lord. Amen.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

This Sunday we read the story of the angel

Gabriel's announcement to Mary about the birth of Jesus. This story is found only in Luke's Gospel. On this fourth Sunday of Advent, the liturgy shifts our attention from John the Baptist to Mary, the mother



of Jesus. Both John and Mary serve as important figures for our reflection during the season of Advent; they both played instrumental roles in preparing the way for Jesus. Last week we reflected on John the Baptist's announcement that the recognized. This week we reflect upon Mary's example of faith and obedience to God, traits which permitted her to receive the angel's message that God's Son would be born as a human person, as one of us.

The story of the Annunciation calls to our attention God's wondrous action in human history. God chose a human person to give birth to his Son so that all humanity would know God's salvation. Mary, already full of God's grace, was able to cooperate in this great plan for our salvation. Thus Jesus was born as one of us, fully human and also fully divine. This is the mystery we prepare to celebrate at Christmas, the mystery of the Incarnation. In the model of Mary, we pray that we coming. We ask this prayer through Christ our will be people of faith who recognize God's saving plan for us and are able respond with obedience.
