
"Child Safety is Everyone's Responsibility"

In 2019, Jay Shelling spent a month on the streets of Frankston, where he encountered a vulnerable group of street kids, some as young as 10 years old, who were facing a range of challenges including neglect, abuse, homelessness, and the formation of dangerous gangs as a means of support.

Recognising the urgent need for healthier family connections and guidance in the lives of these at-risk youth, Jay founded Street Peace. The core mission of Street Peace was to provide youth mentoring aimed at helping these kids make better life decisions and find purpose and hope through love and healthy relationships.

Street Peace is a not-for-profit, faith-based organisation providing outreach, mentoring, training, and employment opportunities for high-risk youth in Frankston and Melbourne's outer South East region. Street Peace partners with and is auspiced by Frankston Life Community, a not-for-profit Charitable organisation that has provided a broad range of services to the community of Frankston and beyond for over 30 years.


